ENGLISH

- Beginning to use full stops and capital letters



PHONICS

We will be focusing on recapping our learning from Reception and begin learning Phase 5. In Phase 5 phonics, we will learn to read and spell some alternative graphemes for sounds we already know

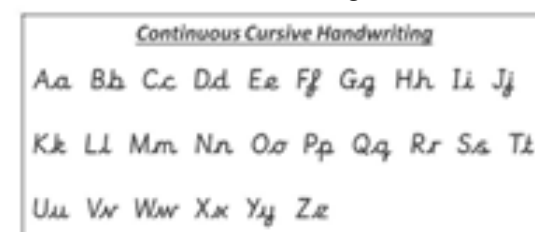
