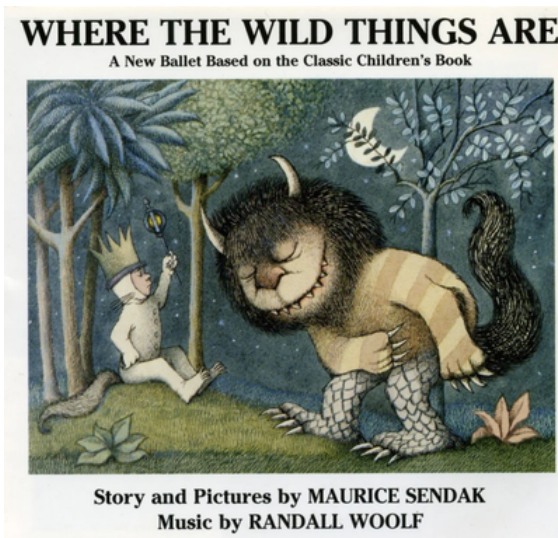


SPRING TERM 2026

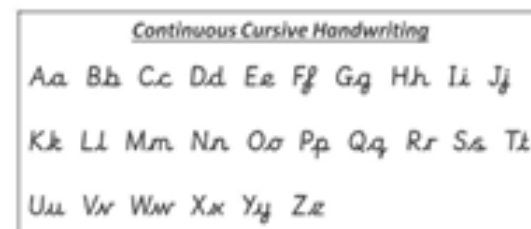

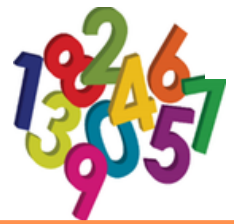


MATHS
